There is no expectation of a commitment to become a Catholic and you are always in charge of how your faith journey evolves. It takes the form of weekly meetings to learn more about the beliefs, practices and traditions of the Catholic faith.

ROSARY GROUP

The Holy Rosary is a worship to God prayed with all the Mysteries reminding us of all the love, life, sacrifice death and resurrection of Jesus. The rosary is a devotion to our Mother Blessed Virgin Mary for the help of all Christians around the world. Everyone is welcome to simply pray the rosary with us at St Paul of the Cross, Mondays 10:30am.

CANDLELIGHT VESPERS AND ADORATION

We celebrate Evening Prayer (Vespers) before the Blessed Sacrament through the tradition of Gregorian chant, in English and Latin. It is not a concert or performance, but a community ritual in which all are invited to join in the recitation of psalms and prayer. It is an opportunity for us to gather in contemplative prayer as a community.

Through our formal links, students attending School of the Nativity have the option to continue their schooling at either Sacred Heart College or Cabra Dominican College.



CARE & CHARITY

VINNIES

Supports local families through home visits and genuine conversation. The team provides practical support such as food hampers and, when needed and available, limited financial assistance. We listen, guide and advocate for people, connecting them with services and opportunities. The aim is to restore dignity, build confidence, and ensure no one feels alone in challenging times.

HOLY FAMILY CARE GROUP

Supports parishioners not able to attend Holy Mass because they are housebound or reside in a local nursing home. Monthly, members attend with Fr Mwaura and Deacon Tee Ping to celebrate Holy Mass in the nursing homes. Members also take Holy Communion to those housebound and in nursing homes. Additionally, transport is provided to bring together senior parishioners for occasional lunchtime social gatherings.

THE ENVIRONMENT



SEASON OF CREATION GROUP

Organises Season of Creation activities acknowledging our responsibility to look after God's creation. Initially focussed on Mercy Grove (below) we are planning other activities that reflect our parish's commitment as an *Earth Care Parish* as well as our response to the encyclical of *Laudato Si*.

MERCY GROVE

Mercy Grove is a contemplative sacred space within Belair National Park established in 2015 by the Blackwood Parish (now part of Holy Family) to mark two significant events that year: publication of Pope Francis' environmental care encyclical *Laudato Si* with and the launch of the Year of Mercy. Having repatriated the site of a demolished gate house, parishioners planted more than 120 plants initially and continue to manage and maintain the site with regular working bees.
